Send the file (in Google Docs format) by email to theobservatoryforhumanrights@gmail.com and write:

- ➔ as the **subject line: Op-Ed by [Your Name and Surname] on "[The Title]"**
- ➔ on the **body** of the email:
 - Author Name and Surname,
 - THE LINK OF YOUR LINKEDIN PROFILE for the “Written by” Reference on the Website and on LinkedIn,
 - THE INSTAGRAM USERNAME and THE LINK OF YOUR PROFILE for tagging you on Instagram,
 - A Brief Explanation of your Article Topic.

TEMPLATE (the article must be written in ENGLISH)

Author Name and Surname

Title of the Article

[Your article text goes here. Make sure it is at least 500 words and no more than 700 words. The article should be engaging and well-structured, ideally with an introduction, body paragraphs, and a conclusion that includes the actions/visions of the international community]

Body:

- Paragraph 1: When & what happened.
- Paragraph 2: Who (victims & aggressors), why it happened, and the location.
- Paragraph 3: Actions taken by the international community/local authorities.

IMPORTANT ➔ Always include links **within the text (Hyperlinks)**, linking to the **sources used** whenever there is **important information, data or quotations** in quotation marks.

All sources listed in the “*Official Sources*” must also be inserted directly in the text as hyperlinks at the exact point where the information was taken, since the “*Official Sources*” serves only as our internal verification tool and will not appear in the published article. You can refer to other articles on our website to see how this should be done.

➔ **IF THESE HYPERLINKS ARE NOT INCLUDED, THE ARTICLE WILL NOT BE PUBLISHED!**

Official Sources in HARVARD Stile - Author(s) or Organisation, Year of publication (in brackets), Title (in italics), Publisher (and sometimes place of publication), link ➔ Example:
